What will I be able to do?



> A short repeated phrase, often played on a lead instrument such as guitar, piano or saxophone.


funk


Pitch

> Notes =same length. Like a ticking clock or a heartbeat.




Notation

Pronounced 'Tamber' It's the quality of a musical note. It's what makes a musical note sound different to another.




Tempo

How loud or quiet the music is




Structure
