

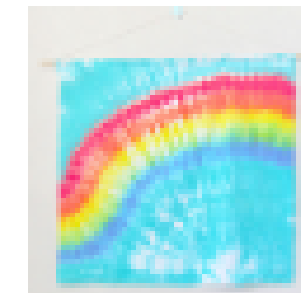
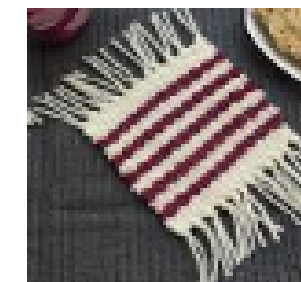

St Chad's Football Team Emblem



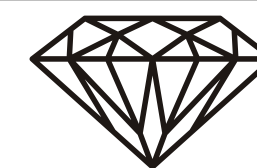
What do I know already? I know how to:

- use their knowledge of Anni Albers to inspire my work



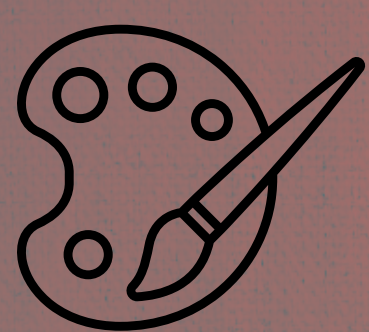
I will know how to create a emblem for St Chad's football team by:

Key Vocabulary:

basting stitch		to sew with long loose stitches so as to hold the work temporarily in place.	felt		a type of fabric that is produced by rolling and pressing different types of fibers together.
blanket stitch		a stitch used to reinforce the edge of thick materials.	running stitch		a sewing stitch made by passing the needle in and out repeatedly with short, even stitches
cross stitch		a needlework stitch that forms an X	symmetry		two matching halves
decoration		the art of making useful things beautiful	textured		how something feels when it is touched



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Artist Focus



Italy has one of the top football teams in the world. With four World Cup titles, Italy is tied with Germany as the most successful tournament participant of all time. They've also won the Olympic football tournament in 1936 and the European Championship in 1968. They're known by the name of Azzurri and for their traditional blue kits. Their emblem demonstrates the style of Italy.



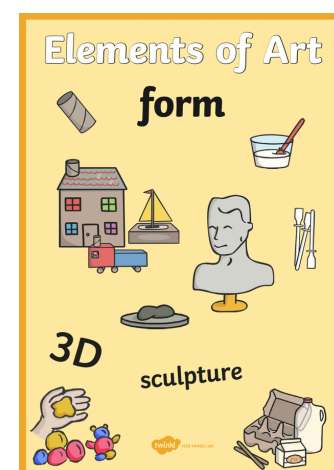
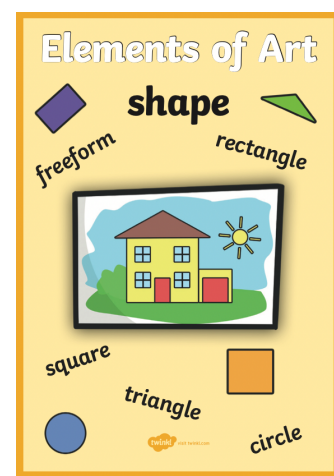

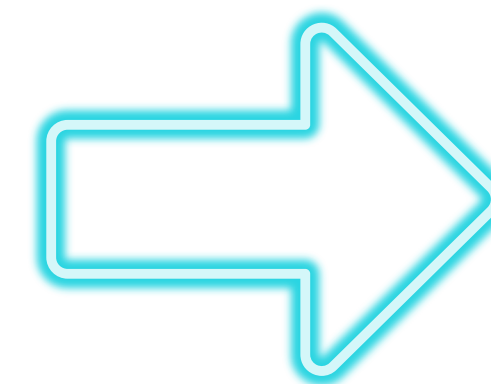
