
What do I already know?

Anni Albers

Anni Albers was a German artist. She was born in Berlin in 1899 and came from a Jewish family. She was interested in art from a young age.

Albers studied at the Bauhaus. The Bauhaus was an exciting school of art and design in Germany. At the time, women were only allowed to study a few classes. Anni decided to study weaving and became one of the greatest textile artists of our time. She believed that textiles are a type of art and as important as painting or sculpture!

Anni Albers was interested in old methods of weaving. She used looms to make many of her textile designs. A loom is a piece of equipment used to make fabrics. People have used looms for a long time. There are different kinds and shapes of looms and Albers usually used a large one to hand-weave her fabrics. Here she is looking through a loom! Can you spot the thread? What do
