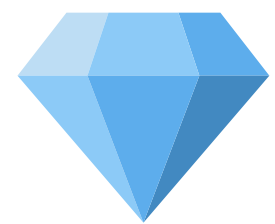
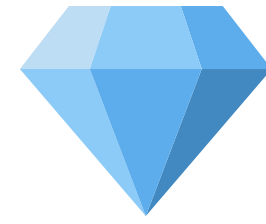

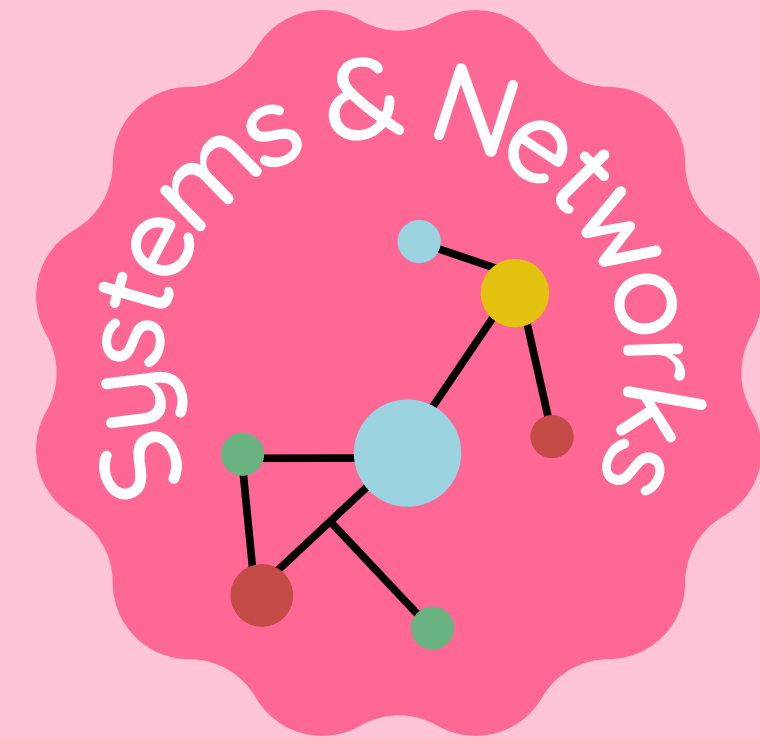

Vocabulary

input	Information or data that is entered into a computer system for processing.
output	Information or data that is produced by a computer after processing.
network	A group of connected computers and devices that can share resources and communicate with each other.
switch	Helps to direct the flow of information in a network and make sure it gets to the right places.
server	A very powerful computer which stores and shares information with other computers.
Wireless Access Point	A device that allows wireless devices to connect to a wired network using Wi-Fi.

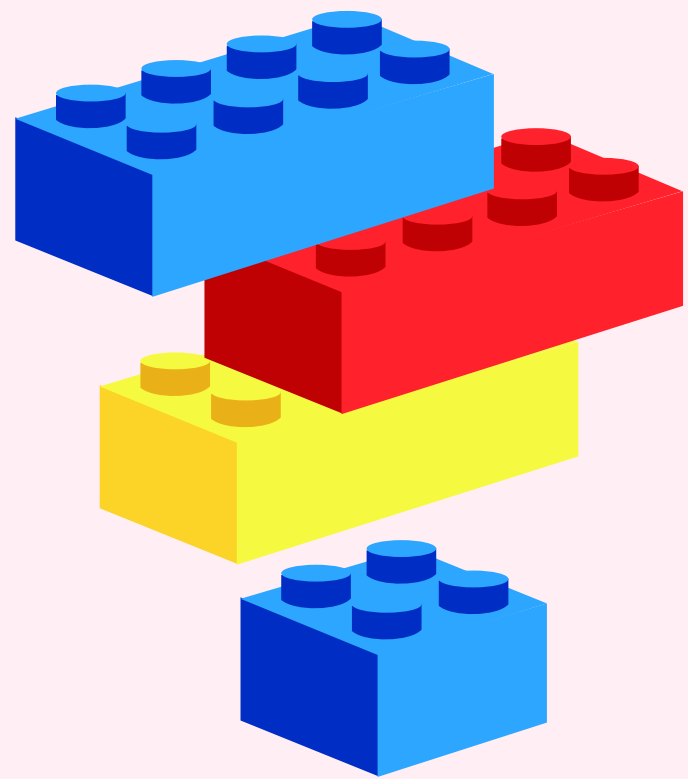

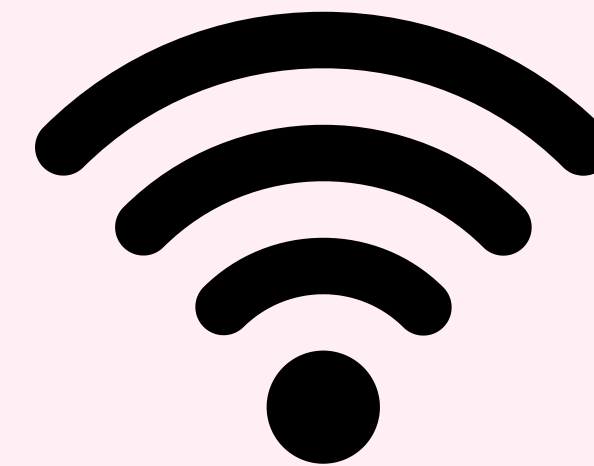
E-Safety Tips

- Always ask an adult before connecting to a new Wi-Fi network or using a computer that is connected to the internet. Adults can help ensure the network is safe and secure.
- Never share your passwords with anyone except your parents or a trusted adult. Make sure to use strong passwords that are hard for others to guess.
- Never click on links or download attachments from people you don't know. These can sometimes be dangerous and harm your computer or steal your information. Always ask an adult if you're unsure about something you see online.
