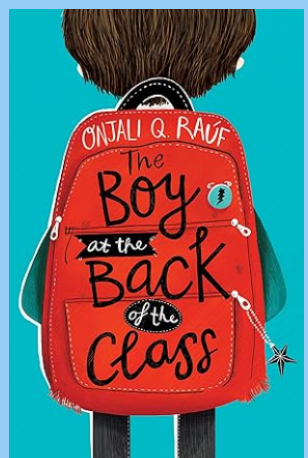
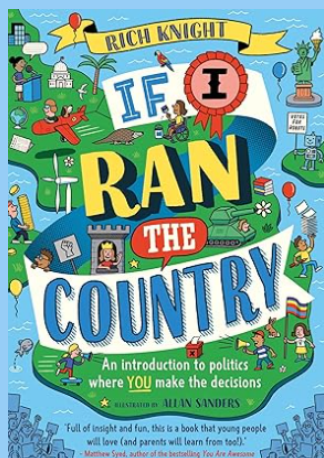
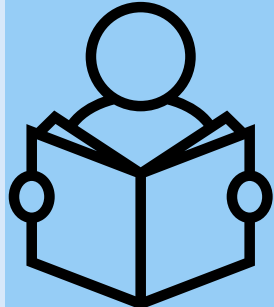
Gems of knowledge

British Values

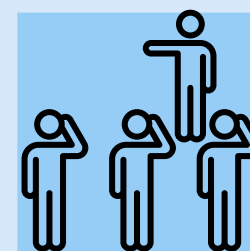

Environment

Authority



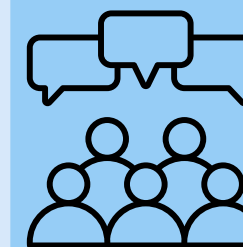
The power or right to make decisions and enforce rules.

Government



A group of people who run the country and make decisions and laws.

Pressure Group



A group of people who try to influence the government or public to make changes about an issue they care about.

House of Lords



The part of Parliament where appointed members review and suggest changes to laws.

House of Commons



The part of Parliament where elected members of parliament (MPs) meet to discuss and make laws

Prime Minister



The leader of the government in the UK, who is in charge of running the country.
